
ARE OUR CHILDREN LEARNING?

LITERACY AND NUMERACY ACROSS EAST AFRICA 2013



Facts to remember based on evidence generated from the Uwezo Annual Learning Assessment conducted in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda in 2012.

LESS THAN ONE THIRD OF PUPILS ENROLLED IN STANDARD 3 IN EAST AFRICA POSSESS BASIC LITERACY AND NUMERACY SKILLS.




29% of Standard 3 pupils passed the numeracy test while 25% passed the literacy test.

Only 16% passed both the literacy and numeracy tests combined.






THERE ARE LARGE DIFFERENCES IN LEARNER ACHIEVEMENT AMONG THE THREE EAST AFRICAN COUNTRIES, WITH KENYA PERFORMING BETTER THAN THE OTHER TWO COUNTRIES.



Pass rates for all children aged 10-16

THERE ARE LARGE DIFFERENCES IN PASS RATES AMONG DISTRICTS WITHIN INDIVIDUAL COUNTRIES.



CHILDREN FROM POORER HOUSEHOLDS CONSISTENTLY PERFORM AT LOWER LEVELS ON ALL TESTS AND ACROSS ALL AGES.



Average pass rates on both the literacy and numeracy tests by household socio-economic status, all children aged 10+

ON ANY GIVEN SCHOOL DAY ONE TEACHER IS ABSENT FROM A PUBLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL IN KENYA AND UGANDA AND TWO TEACHERS ABSENT IN TANZANIA.
